# United Nations Forum on Business and Human Rights

## Background:

On June 16, 2011, the United Nations Human Rights Council established the United Nations Forum on Business and Human Rights by the adoption of resolution 17/4. This resolution adopted the "UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights: Implementing the United Nations 'Protect, Respect, and Remedy' Framework" and established the Working Group on the issue of human rights and transnational corporations and other business enterprises.

## Mandate:

To discuss trends and challenges in the implementation of the Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights. To promote dialogue and cooperation on issues related to business and human rights, including challenges arising in specific sectors concerning particular rights or groups. Additionally, it seeks to identify best practices.

## Participants:

The Forum brings together various stakeholders, including states, United Nations mechanisms, specialized bodies, funds, and programs; intergovernmental organizations; regional human rights mechanisms; national human rights institutions; transnational and other businesses; business associations; labor unions; academics; representatives of indigenous peoples; and affected individuals and groups.



## Methodology:

Since 2012, the Forum has been held annually over a three-day period. One day is dedicated to preparatory meetings and exchanges on new instruments and experiences (resolutions 17/4, 26/22, and 44/15).

The Forum is directed and chaired by the Working Group on the issue of human rights and transnational corporations and other business enterprises (resolutions 17/4, 35/7, and 44/15).

The program of the Forum is prepared by the Working Group. It includes sessions led by the Working Group as well as side events proposed by stakeholders. The Working Group compiles and presents a report to the Human Rights Council summarizing the discussions and recommendations.

## What is the Forum?

- It is a space for dialogue involving multiple stakeholders on the subject of business and human rights.
- It is the largest annual global gathering on business and human rights.
- Since 2012, ten annual forums on business and human rights have been held.



## Opportunities for Indigenous Peoples

- Engage in dialogue with members of the Working Group on Business and Human Rights and other UN mechanisms.
- Provide information about the situation in their territories affected by business activities.
- Share their experiences of participation in the implementation of the Guiding Principles.
- Participate in the Indigenous Peoples Caucus prior to the 12th United Nations Forum on Business and Human Rights.

# 12th United Nations Forum on Business and Human Rights

Geneva, November 27-29, 2023

## Main Theme:

Towards Effective Change in Implementing Obligations, Responsibilities and Remedies

## Key Issues:

This Forum will reflect on the real changes that have occurred in the implementation of these standards. This includes actions taken by states to incorporate these standards through regulations and public policies, the extent to which companies have applied these standards in their practices across all activities, and whether judicial and non-judicial remedy mechanisms in this field are more available and accessible to those adversely affected by human rights abuses related to business activities.

Participants will analyze whether these changes have been effective, especially for rights holders, to what extent, and what remains to be done.

Approximately 35 working sessions are planned over the three days of the event, including one related to Just Transition in the Energy and Extractive Industries.

A session addressing Progress and Opportunities to Strengthen the Business and Human Rights Agenda in the Latin America and Caribbean region has also been scheduled.

Another session of interest is the Updated OECD Guidelines: A New Roadmap for Tackling Climate Change.

Additionally, there is a session dedicated to Progress and Opportunities for Human Rights Due Diligence and the Environment Practice

One of the most important sessions is focused on the role of indigenous peoples in promoting the business and human rights agenda.
